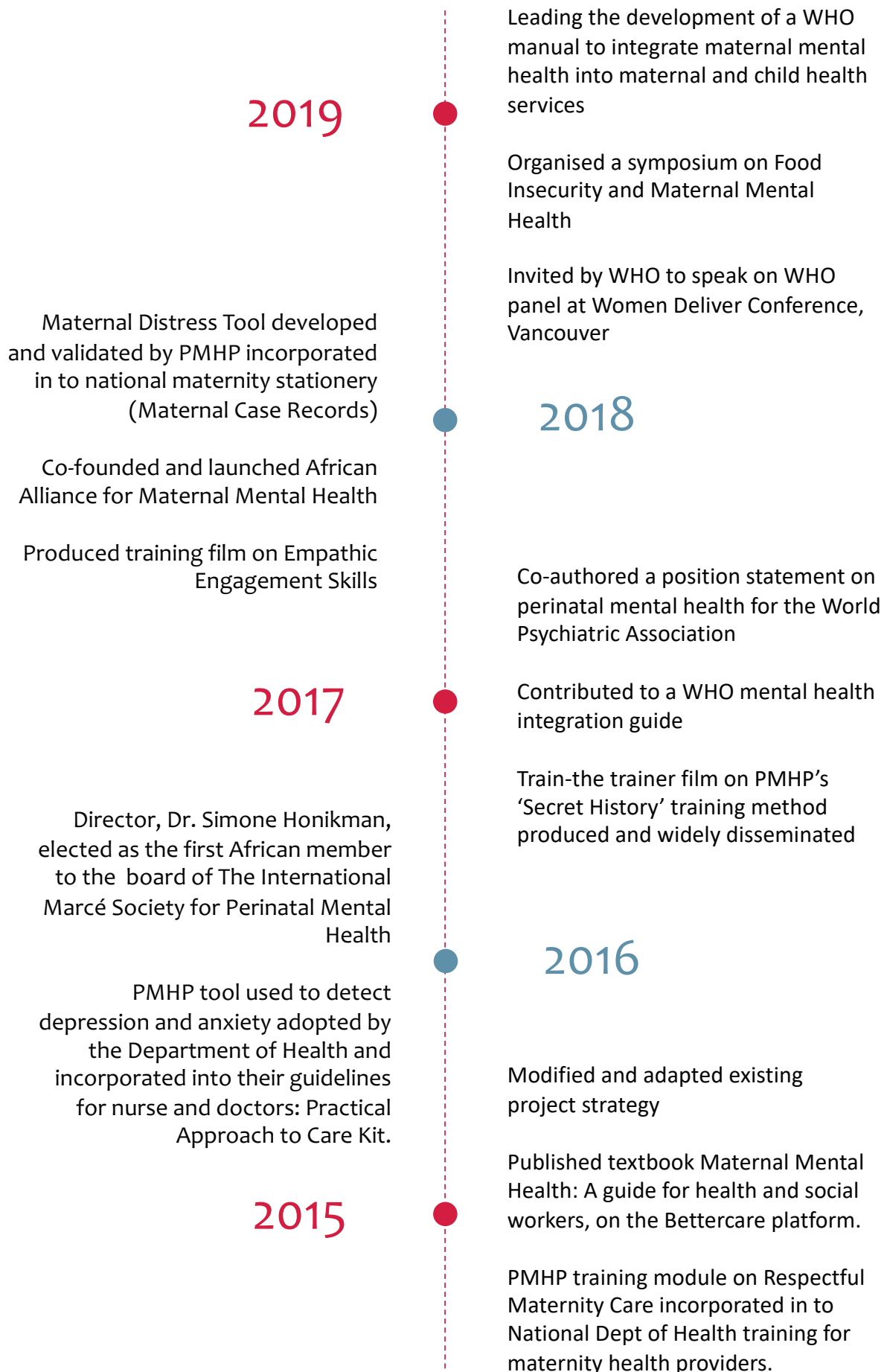




## Key accomplishments
